On Thursday, March 18, 2021, the 5th ABEST21 Online Workshop "Assuring the Quality of the Online Lectures" was held with Vice Dean Dr. Ainur Rofiq, Faculty of Economics and Business, Universitas Brawijaya, Indonesia and Director Nalinee Mohprasit, Ph.D., Faculty of Business, Economics and Communications, Naresuan University, Thailand as Speakers.





Dr. Ainur Rofiq explained about current situation on online education provided by universities in Indonesia based on statistical data. Their statistical data showed more than 65% classes offered by universities in

Indonesia has been conducted online bases during the COVID-19 pandemic. The major problem that they have faced is poor internet connection for both lectures and students. In order to improve online education environments, UB has tried to conduct synchronized classes and plans to introduce "Standard Work Procedures" in their laboratories. After his presentation, they discussed how to improve quality of online lectures especially, examination classes. Some participants shared his experience on conducting online examination using "Google classroom".



Dr. Nalinee Mohprasit introduced their experience about how to solve problems that students have faced during COVID-19 pandemic. The top three problems they are facing are financial problem, inequalities of

access to online learnings and lack of online learning skills. She explained that the university has offered to discount for tuition fee for all students to solve the students' financial problems. For improving internet environment, the university provides them mobile sim cards with data access. Also, she introduced "ADDIE Model" that has been almost a standard for professionally developed, high quality distance education programs and explained that the ADDIE Model is also used in corporate e-learning and training (Bates, 2019). After her presentation, they discussed whether lectures will be able to have freedom to innovate their class design and so on.
